## SOCIETY OF FELLOWS CALL-FOR-APPLICATIONS

### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Kinder Institute's Society of Fellows is a competitive, all-expense-paid fellowship program exclusive to undergraduate students enrolled at the University of Missouri that provides participants with the opportunity to engage in a yearlong interdisciplinary exploration of the philosophical foundations, historical development, and contemporary practice of constitutional democracy in the United States.

# Members of the 2016-2017 Society of Fellows will participate in the following events: Summer Seminar: Wednesday, August 10, 2016 – Saturday, August 13, 2016

The Society of Fellows begins each year with a residential summer seminar. Qualifying applicants will spend four days and three nights at the historic Tiger Hotel in downtown Columbia examining key ideas, figures, and events in the history of American constitutional democracy through a program of lectures and discussions led by Kinder Institute faculty. Full attendance and participation in the 2016 Summer Seminar is a required component of the fellowship.

### Dinner Discussions: September 2016, November 2016, February 2017, April 2017

Fellows will continue their inquiry into the theory, history, and practice of American constitutional democracy during the school year through quarterly dinner discussions with MU faculty members and invited guests of the Kinder Institute. These discussions will be held in Columbia, MO, on one evening in each of the four months listed above. Attendance at all dinner discussion events is also a requirement of participation in the Society of Fellows.

### Student-edited Journal on Constitutional Democracy (optional)

Fellows also will have the opportunity to participate in the creation of the 2016-2017 edition of the student-run *Journal on Constitutional Democracy*. Each edition of the *Journal* is organized around a new student-selected theme and consists of articles that examine this theme as it relates to constitutional democracy in historical, global, and contemporary contexts. At the conclusion of the Summer Seminar, fellows will be able to apply to participate in the *Journal* for course credit during the 2016-2017 academic year.

### APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

The Society of Fellows application consists of three components: (1) A questionnaire, formatted as an interactive PDF and found on page 2 of this document; (2) A current resume; and (3) Two short essay responses, prompts for which are found on page 3 of this document.
