2020-21 Kinder Postdoctoral Fellow in American Political Thought & Constitutionalism

The Kinder Institute on Constitutional Democracy at the University of Missouri is currently accepting applications for a 2020-21 Postdoctoral Fellow in American Political Thought and Constitutionalism, with the possibility of renewal for the 2021-22 academic year. Founded in 2014, the Kinder Institute is an interdisciplinary signature academic center at MU dedicated to excellence in research, teaching, and community engagement on the subject of American political thought, history, and institutions, with a particular emphasis on the ideas and events of the American Founding and their continued global impact and relevance today.

A Ph.D. in Political Science or Government is required by the time the fellowship begins in August 2020. Candidates' work should align broadly with the Kinder Institute's scholarly mission.

The Fellowship is a full-time position that comes with a competitive salary, university benefits, an office at the Kinder Institute, and dedicated funds for conference travel, research, and other professional expenses. Funds are also available to help offset moving costs. The Postdoctoral Fellow will teach two classes in the Fall 2020 semester and one class in the Spring 2021 semester. At least one of these courses will either be "Intellectual World of the American Founders" or "Constitutional Debates," small, discussion-based seminars associated with the common curriculum for the new B.A. in Constitutional Democracy.
