Panel 1: “Democracy and the Public” | 10:30 AM

Jasmine deGroat, Molly Miller, and Isaiah Spellman will explore the forces which the public exerts on democracy. Using both international, comparative research and deep dives at the state level, the panelists will analyze the interplay between nationalism, populism, and public approval on political systems.

Panel 2: “Democracy and Freedom” | 11:45 AM

Emily Reed, Yasmeen Hanon, and Thomas Bruns will focus on the nature of freedom in all its dimensions. Their papers will critically evaluate long-held truisms in political philosophy, including the courts as bulwarks of freedom, the political resource curse, and the nature of the free press in American history.

Panel 3: “Democracy and Civic Development” | 2:00 PM

Using political structures in non-human primates as a foundational control group, Elisha Schoor, Bobby Lee, and Oli McCann will look closely into two very different communities to highlight the impact of factors such as transportation and density on the development and change of civic institutions.
